Sneakers became standard-issue for the first time in January, after Congress passed a 2017 defense provision requiring the military to provide American-made athletic shoes to recruits directly. But for decades, sneakers were exempt from that rule. Instead, recruits were given about \$90 to buy shoes themselves. The Pentagon argued U.S. made shoes were too costly, too limited, and not durable enough to meet the military's needs. "Right now our recruits are getting injured, because they're told to go over to the BX and buy some shoes," said Martha McSally during a debate on the House floor. McSally, a veteran and longtime runner, was then a House member and is now a Senator from Arizona. "Most of them have no idea: Am I a pronator? A supinator? Do I have a high arch? A medium arch? They buy shoes based on price ... or buy based on which ones they think look good," McSally said. "The military has allowed cash allowances for some time because they recognized the need for personal choices in personal matters," Sanford said. "For instance, women's undergarments.
